Meet Your Lodge Executive Committee (LEC)

Olivia Tharp is our Vice Chief, Program, and she took a few minutes to talk to *The Arrow*.

NOAC is Headed to Knoxville in '22

What's a NOAC, you ask? The National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) is the flagship national Order of the Arrow event. It is held every two years at a major university campus and is typically attended by as many as 8,000 Arrowmen from all 50 states. It is second only to the BSA National Jamboree in size and scope. Our largest conference was in 2015, attended by more than 15,000 Arrowmen to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Order of the Arrow. We expect at least 6,000 Arrowmen to attend in 2022.

NOAC will be held July 25 – July 30, 2022 at The University of Tennessee, Knoxville. UT Knoxville also hosted the 1977, 1992 and 2000 national OA conferences.


