- Remember, you MUST be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America to be in the OA.






# How to Set Up Troop and Crew Elections


# Golden Kernel a Logical Move for Arrowmen

### **Section C-3A No More??**

To those of you who have not heard, our very own Terry Hendriex is no longer the Central Region Chief. This is because the Central Region no longer existed after December 28, 2021.

There will now only be two regions, the Gateway and Eastern Region. Our lodge and the rest of Section C-3A will be in Gateway Region Section 8 (G8).

All of these changes are being incorporated through Project Magellan. This effort was introduced after it was decided at the national level that having a four region structure was financially and operationally unstable. There will only be two regions, but sections boundaries will remain.

## **Don't Forget Adult Nominations**

Remember to nominate adult Scouters for membership in our lodge. Nominations can be made online, via the Inductions Module of Lodgemaster or using a paper form under Resources/Forms/Files on wg23.org. Nominations are due May 21, 2022.

To recommend an adult, a unit must hold a youth election and elect at least one youth. The number of adults nominated can be no more than two-thirds of the number of youth elected, rounded up where the number of youth candidates is not a multiple of three.

The camping requirements for adult nominees is the same as for youth: 15 days and nights of Boy Scout camping during the two-year period before the election.

## **Positive Tornado Impact**

We are all very thankful that no one was injured by the June 18 tornado that struck our camp, nor in the extensive cleanup effort led by our many volunteers. But would you be surprised that the twister actually had a positive impact on ISR?

According to Ranger Biggs, the camp's advance warning of the tempest was thanks to Camp Director Bill Maddox's personal storm-tracking software. Due to its obvious benefit, our council has now purchased similar software for use at ISR, to help warn of future storms.

In addition, the council is already at work planning the purchase and installation of storm shelters to give additional protection to campers. An exact installation date is not yet known.


