- <u>To be eligible for the Vigil Honor.</u> Many years, some nominations are declined due to membership lapse!
- Your dues payment keeps you as <u>an active member</u> of the Lodge, which means you can stay involved in all of the opportunities in the OA.
- Dues keep our lodge <u>financially strong</u>. The money you pay goes toward many things, including annual inductions, service projects, communication and more.
- Only dues-paid members will receive emailed/mailed newsletters and other information. Renew soon, or this may be your last newsletter!
- You must be a dues-paid member to attend OA events throughout the year, like the Spring and Fall Fellowships, Winter Banquet, OA High Adventures, Section events, OA training and NOAC.
- Remember, you MUST be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America to be in the OA.


